## PTA Resolution

PTA resolutions are official documents outlining the opinion, will, or intent of the association to address problems, situations, or concerns that affect children and youth and require action to seek resolution on the issue. They serve an important purpose in formalizing and focusing the positions of the organization on various important and relevant issues.

Over the last six years, the state funding for many of the programs that support our students’ learning has declined. We cannot expect students to learn without textbooks and other learning materials, without preschool, and without extra help to catch up. Their teachers cannot help them when funding for their learning has evaporated. At the general meeting on December 18, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, an excellent public school system is vital to the quality of life in the commonwealth of Kentucky and fundamental to preserving a strong democratic society both now and in the future; and

WHEREAS, upon passage of Senate Bill 1 (now called Unbridled Learning), the members of the Kentucky Legislature pledged to ensure that Kentucky’s students would have the tools they need to compete in a global society; and

WHEREAS, the mandates of Unbridled Learning continue to increase, putting additional stress and responsibilities on teachers and administrators working to ensure that students continue on their path to becoming college- and career-ready; and

WHEREAS, we are asking parents to be part of working with their child at home, to be a part of Unbridled Learning, and to ensure that their child continues on a path to becoming college- and career-ready; and

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Legislature has broken its pledge to Kentucky’s students by failing to fund the mandates of Unbridled Learning, thereby putting at risk its goals and jeopardizing the future of our students; and

WHEREAS, the failure of the Kentucky Legislature has caused the school districts across the commonwealth to make significant cuts to their budgets and to personnel, compelling school boards to increase property taxes in order that districts might continue to operate and serve the students, who are the future of the commonwealth;

NOW THEREFORE, we the members of the 15th District PTA, which includes 42,000 members, do challenge the members of the Kentucky State House of Representatives and the Kentucky State Senate to take action, putting the students of the commonwealth of Kentucky first, reinvesting in their future, and fully funding appropriate mandates of Unbridled Learning to ensure that Kentucky’s public education system can offer students the path to college and career readiness.

# 15th District PTA Evangeline J. Sansome Scholarship

All senior high students attending JCPS high schools are encouraged to apply for this need-based scholarship available through the 15th District PTA, 319 South 15th Street, Louisville, Kentucky, 40203.

The student's needs and desire to further his or her education will be considered along with academic standing. This scholarship is applicable to any type of training or schooling necessary to prepare for a chosen career. Some restrictions will apply. This is for tuition only.

The value of the scholarship will be determined in April. For the last few years, we have provided scholarships valued at \$1,700 each.

Qualifications for 15th District PTA Evangeline J. Sansome Scholarship:

- Graduating seniors attending a JCPS high school whose PTSA is a unit of the Kentucky Congress of Parents and Teachers and has paid national, state, and district dues sent via U.S. mail and postmarked by **March 15, 2014**; the school's PTSA bylaws must be current and updated as well.
- The student must be a member of his or her school's PTSA. The PTSA must meet the requirements above.
- The scholarship is need-based. Tax records will be required. An essay will require you to state why you need this scholarship. **The scholarship is for tuition only.**
- A minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.7; transcript; and three letters of recommendation from your school, church, community leaders, or employers is required. One letter of recommendation must be from your current high school principal or senior counselor. The scholarship application is due **March 15, 2014**.

- \$500 Parent-Member Scholarship—This award is given to a PTA or Parent Teacher Student Association (PTSA) parent member who is working toward a degree in education or a health field at an accredited Kentucky public college or university.
- Christa McAuliffe Rising Star Award—This is given to students who have successfully worked to improve their grades, attendance, attitude, character, and/or self-esteem.
