

Tips to a Successful Membership Campaign

Membership growth is a sign that your PTA is doing well and shows the PTA's importance to the school, community, students, and families. If the goal of your PTA is to be effective in developing good relationships with students, families, schools, and the community, then begin by laying the groundwork that helps foster respect and enthusiasm in being a part of the association. Provide a foundation for your PTA's success by doing the following:

- Start with your PTA Board; seek its full support of the membership campaign by attending membership campaign events/activities. This shows that you lead by example. Also, remember that board members must join the PTA.
- Set a membership goal. Start by increasing last year's membership numbers.
- Create a theme.
- Have a table at school functions and events, especially at the beginning of the school year (e.g., registration, orientation, open house, family fun nights).
- Have membership cards, envelopes, pens, and a smile ready to greet potential members.
- Prepare membership forms, take-home fliers, and promotional signs for distribution to the school, community, and businesses.
- Send letters to last year's members asking them to join again.
- Ask your PTA Board members to explain to potential members what your PTA does for the students and community when they seek to increase membership. This demonstrates that your PTA is more than just a fundraising association.

To help your PTA stay on track, maintain good membership record-keeping and be in compliance throughout the membership campaign:

- Find out how your treasurer would like to handle the collection and deposit of membership fees.
- Make sure the memberships of PTA Board members are current.
- Remember that membership campaigns never end. Your PTA should always be encouraging potential members to join the PTA.

Membership VPs and treasurers, remember that you have to send a Kentucky State and National PTA dues payment by **October 15**. You also have to send a payment by the 15th of the month for each month that new members join.

Block Grants Will Put Student Achievement at Risk

Over the past several years, Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) students have benefited from the new opportunities and program expansions of United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Child Nutrition Programs. These programs include the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) and the At Risk Supper Program. CEP, which allows students at qualifying schools to receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch at no charge, has not only increased access to healthy meals during the school day but also removed any stigma of participating in school Child Nutrition Programs. The expansion of the Child and Adult Care Food Program's (CACFP's) At Risk Supper Program has made it possible for JCPS to provide nutritional support for after-school enrichment programs. Students no longer have to choose between staying for the educational services that they need or filling their growling stomachs.

Child Nutrition Programs are now in danger! The U.S. House of Representatives' proposal for Child Nutrition Reauthorization, HR 5003, which was passed out of the House Education and Workforce Committee, includes a three-state block grant pilot for child nutrition programs. It also proposes raising the threshold for participation in CEP. Both of these proposals, **especially block grants**, could have a devastating impact on Child Nutrition Programs and the role they play in supporting academic achievement and addressing childhood hunger and food insecurity.

What could this mean for JCPS Child Nutrition Programs? Under this proposal, a school district would receive the same funding that it has received the previous year in one lump sum. Currently, the USDA funds Child Nutrition Programs through an entitlement grant. This means that JCPS is paid for each reimbursable meal (meals that meet the nutritional requirements) they serve to a student. There is currently no limit to the number of meals a school district can serve and receive reimbursement for. This allows JCPS School and Community Nutrition Services (SCNS) to constantly try to increase participation, repair/replace equipment, provide training, and implement new programs that are made available to us. Our goal is to provide the most students with the highest nutrition possible and give students more opportunities to consume healthy foods. Block grants would provide a single pot of money, and once it is gone, services could end or the district's general fund would have to cover the expenses. This could take money from the classroom or other areas in the district where money is needed.

It is a school nutrition director's worst nightmare that he or she would have to close the doors before the last day of school. It could result in breakfasts, lunches, snacks, or dinners not being available for students. The tighter budget restrictions would also affect the way purchases are viewed. Parents know from personal experience that when you are trying to make your food budget last to the end of the month or—in the case of JCPS SCNS—the end of the school year, sometimes choices have to be limited or less expensive items must be menued to ensure needs can be met. Block grants could also give more power for state agencies to set program regulations. This could cause inconsistencies across the nation in the nutritional requirements for meals.

Help us "Stop the Block"! The School Nutrition Association (SNA) is actively working to Stop the Block, and we need the help of all of our allied organizations, including the 15th District Parent Teacher Association (PTA) and everyone concerned about student achievement

and childhood hunger. I encourage you and others you may know to reach out to our members of Congress and tell them to Stop the Block.





Dear PTA Leader,

We ask that you check with your principal to see if you can hold a Voter Registration Drive at your school's Open House, Parent/Teacher Conference or any other school event you might have before October 10, 2016.

Each School Will Receive a Kit Containing:

- Voter registration forms
- Manila envelope, pre-addressed to Election Center that the voter registration forms can be placed in once they are completed
- Each school building has a JCTA Representative that will return the pre-addressed Election Center envelope to be mailed in by October 10, 2016

To be eligible to register to vote, you must:

- Be a citizen of the United States and be 18 or older on or before the General Election November 8, 2016
- Not be a convicted felon. *If you have been convicted of a felony, your civil rights must have been restored*
- Not have been judged "mentally incompetent" in a court of law
- New registrations, address changes, or name changes must be made no later than October 11, 2016 for the November 8, 2016 General Election.
