



We're thrilled to announce the opening of the 15th District Parent Teacher Association (PTA) Clothing Assistance Program (CAP), 1400 West Jefferson Street, Louisville, KY 40203.

The program began on November 1, 1971, with a dedicated group of PTA parent/quardian volunteers, who started a small closet storage space to address students' needs for appropriate clothing, shoes, and accessories. Now, CAP is a thriving partnership between the nonprofit 15th District PTA and the Jefferson County Public Schools (JCPS) Diversity, Equity, Poverty (DEP) Division. This new location is a significant upgrade, and it continues the same spirit of service and advocacy that launched the program.

CAP serves as a districtwide resource for thousands of JCPS families and students. offering personal shopper services and in-person appointments all school year. CAP offers large giveaways for families and school resource providers, supports school events and programs by providing products and incentives, offers meaningful volunteer opportunities, and honors the magnanimous generosity of nonprofit and corporate donors.

Families can receive service twice each school year. All requests should go through their school service providers, who have access to our app.

Highlights of the new space:

- A street-facing, 24,000-square-foot building on a major thoroughfare just three blocks from an interstate exit
- A 10,000-square-foot heated warehouse with industrial shelving storage and open spaces for special event browsing
- A 5,000-square-foot heated and air-conditioned volunteer workstation with two Big Ass fans and a GE refrigerator/icemaker (donated by GE Appliances)
- A 5,000-square-foot family shopping room with a changing room as well as a centrally located public restroom with a changing table
- A laundry room with three sets of GE clothes washers and dryers (donated by GE Appliances)
- 85 parking spaces (large enough for special event parking or for easy navigation of delivery trucks)


